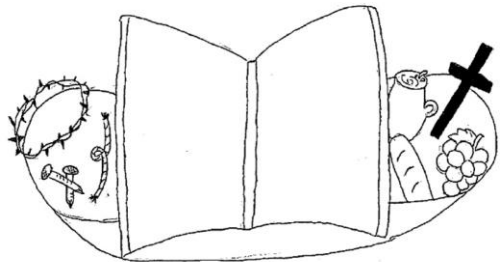
Identity Revealed: Jesus calls you blessed

You may not feel blessed when you are hungry or insulted or mourning the death of a loved one.

You may not be in the mood to boast when you feel foolish, weak, or lowly.

But God's ways are not the world's ways. God's strength is not man's strength. God has chosen things that are foolish, weak, and despised by this world to display his ultimate power and bring eternal victory. He wraps himself in flesh and is born in a stable. He humbles himself and conquers all his enemies through a cross.

Jesus chose you to be his own. He gives you gifts upon gifts and grace upon grace, and as you take up your cross and follow him, he calls you blessed.



The student artist captured the theme for today. Jesus reminds us we are blessed through the many gifts he bestows on us, both physically (food and drink on the right side) and most importantly, spiritually (God's Word being the focal point of the picture). Jesus' lowliness and humiliation is depicted through the cross, thorns, nails, and rope.

Service of the Word

Much of today's service has been planned and selected by the 7th and 8th grade music class. Each year, every student in our school studies parts of our Lutheran worship. As a culminating activity to their studies, these upper-grade students planned today's pre-service, offering, and post-service music, the hymns, the Kyrie and Gloria, the Gospel Acclamation and psalm. Not only did they choose the content, but they also made decisions on how to present it (spoken vs. sung, with instruments or without, etc.) Artwork was also done by a few students. As a whole, they learned the basics of planning worship that is centered around a theme and chosen Scripture lessons. They learn the importance of Christ-centered content and are taught the dynamic nature of our Lutheran liturgy and ways in which all people of all ages participate in sharing the gospel.

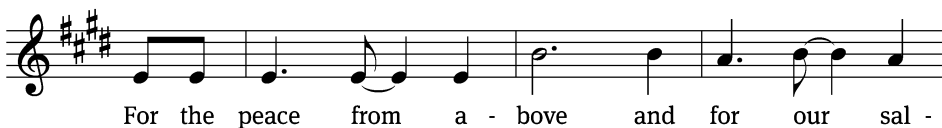

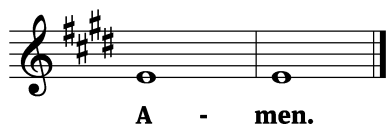
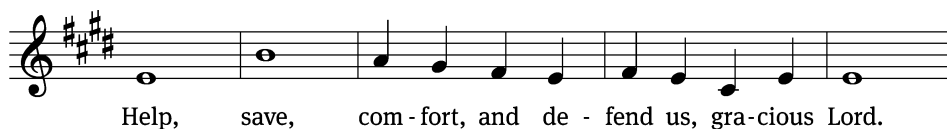
